What does dedicated staff plus incredible supporters equal? Over 800 animals helped this year at CCHS. The COVID 19 pandemic has brought many changes to CCHS over the past 18 months. We had to be closed to the public much of the time. Volunteer help was very limited. We had to pivot from live fundraising activities to virtual events to raise money to help the animals. Your support really helped us get through this difficult time. We thought you would love to know more about CCHS and how together we help the animals in our care.

What does CCHS do exactly? As a shelter, we handle the stray dogs within the community and receive animals affected by state cruelty and neglect laws. We also take in pets that are dropped off by their owners for various reasons. CCHS is also an animal rescue organization. We are essentially the "safe haven" for dogs and cats for whatever reason, do not have a home. One example would be when their owner passed away and they become homeless.



CCHS provides a temporary home for animals until they are adopted into permanent homes.

Our dedicated staff works diligently behind the scenes caring for the dogs and cats at the shelter. Each day they arrive early in the morning and are greeted by 40-60 cats and dogs just

waiting to be let out and fed. They clean and sanitize kennels, cat rooms, office area and bathrooms. They pick up, haul and deliver all the necessary supplies needed at the shelter. The staff then returns in the



evening to do it all over again. It is not a glamorous job, but our staff is the definition of an "essential worker."

The staff is also trained to administer medications, vaccinations and other medical treatments to the dogs and cats. They assist the public by phone, email, social media, answering questions, concerns, setting up appointments and helping with lost and found animals. They provide transport to and from veterinary appointments, respond to emergency animal situations. They often assist in live trap rescue measures for animals that are too afraid to come to people.

It takes many hours and physical work each day to get this all accomplished. Our wonderful staff and shelter manager make a difference in the lives of homeless

animal by showing up to CCHS every day. YOU make CCHS possible by supporting CCHS and all we do for the animals! THANK YOU for making a difference!

How important are your donations?

From the outside looking in, it can be difficult to know the impact of a donation. To the animals, the gift is literally a lifesaver. Private donations are the backbone of CCHS. Without your support, we wouldn't be able to operate a shelter, rescue animals or provide assistance programs for the community. It all adds up to saving lives and giving second chances for a good life.

Medical care is our number one expense.

Stray and homeless animals often arrive at the shelter in pretty rough shape. Everything from infections to untreated allergies to more serious injuries and illnesses like lyme disease or heartworm. Some animals require emergency surgery while others need long term care and medication. We also provide routine vet care for the animals that come to CCHS which includes spay/neuter, microchips and vaccinations. Medical care is essential to saving animals. We are fortunate to work with the local Veterinary Clinics who provide CCHS with discounted services but it is still a huge expense.
